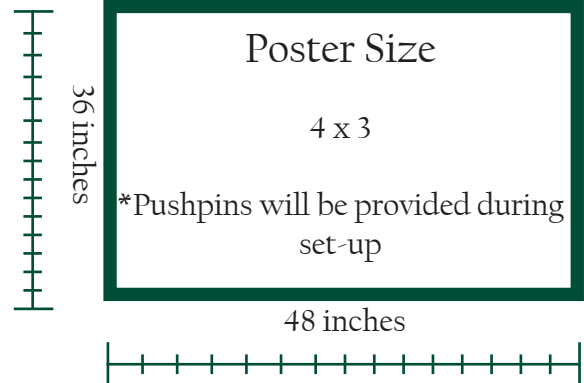

Poster Presentation Guidelines

PowerPoint Tips

- Set your poster size before you start working on it.
- Go to “Design” tab, click “Slide Size,” select “Page Setup,” select “Standard (4x3)” or “Custom” and enter 48 inches for width and 36 inches for height.



- ### Presentation Tips
- Avoid dark poster backgrounds, white is preferred; watch out for color mismatches as they may not look good when printed.
 - Use bullets, preferably with phrases, not full sentences.
 - Do not include the full abstract.
 - Use graphs, tables, and figures wisely to display pertinent information instead of text as posters are visual aids.
 - You can move headings around as needed.

Objectives/Aim Statement <i>SMART Aim with improvement metrics</i>	Discussion <i>Summary of main outcomes, strengths/successes, limitations, and suggestions to improve</i>	References Font 18-24 for References	
Methods <i>Improvement framework, PDSA Cycle, intervention implementation, instruments, data collection</i>
